



Improvements:


- Add 1.5 miles passing track

Improvements:


- Drainage structures

- 3 projects currently in construction










EARLY ACTION PROGRAM



SANDAG Has An Exciting Opportunity

- Accelerate delivery of prioritized projects
- Apply the 5 Big Moves Complete Corridors strategy
- Get \$1.4 billion in projects shovel-ready to compete for construction funds
- Position projects throughout the region to apply for competitive funding sooner
- Use \$130 million in *TransNet* funds to invest nearly \$460 million in *TransNet* projects



- Strategic proposal to amend FY 20 Budget
 - Focuses limited funding on environmental and design work
 - Increases project competitiveness
 - Kick starts work now vs. waiting until May 2020
- Addresses long-standing needs
 - Applies Complete Corridor strategy
- Advances project delivery
- Consistent with TransNet measure
- Reduces the risk of losing funds



Airport Connectivity Subcommittee Summary



- Create multi-modal hub with regional connections to the Airport
- New direct transit connection to/from the Airport
- More direct path for auto traffic to/from the Airport
- Laurel Street to serve as primary airport access
- Harbor Drive to be converted into next great waterfront street with dedicated transit lanes
- Reduce airport traffic on Grape and Hawthorn Streets
- Maintain Pacific Highway for local auto traffic and active transportation solutions




CONCEPT OPTIONS ANALYZED




- Central Mobility Hub at NAVWAR with high speed people mover in tunnel
