



Program Overview:

- Focus on Diversity & Non-Discrimination
- Small Local Business Enterprise (SLBE) Program

Program Requirements:

- Submittal of Work Force Reports and/or Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) Plan prior to Contract Award
- SLBE program applied to City funded Construction and A&E contracts

Subcontracting Opportunities:

- 20% Goal on A&E Contracts; preference points awarded for SLBE sub participation
- Mandatory SLBE Goals on MACC Contracts (No GFE)
- SLBE goals or GFE on construction projects over \$500k

SD Contract Requirements: Prevailing Wage

Applies to:

- Construction work over \$25,000
- Alteration, demolition, repair or maintenance work over \$15,000

State prevailing wage on City and/or State funded projects

Davis-Bacon requirements on Federally funded projects



General Requirements

Specialty Insurance (when applicable)

Contractors Pollution Liability Hazardous Transporters Builder's Risk Railroad Protective Liability Architect's & Engineer's Professional Insurance (Errors & Omissions)



Bid Submittal

Bid security due at time of bid in the amount not less than 10% of the total bid amount in the form of: 1. cashier's check; 2. certified check; or 3. corporate security bond.

Contract Award

- 1. Payment bond (Materials and Labor Bond) for not less than 100% of the contract price to satisfy claims of material suppliers and of mechanics and laborers employed on the project.
- Performance Bond for 100% of the contract price to guarantee faithful performance of work within the time prescribed and in a manner satisfactory to the City.

Contractor shall maintain the bond in full force and effect until Acceptance and until all claims for materials and labor are paid and shall otherwise comply with Government Code.
