




Pre-Qualified Service Providers (PQSP) Bench

Established in 2016, designed for projects valued \$25K - \$5M using Design-Bid-Build Delivery Method. Bid by invitation only to pre-qualified contractors.

License Categories:

- A General Engineering Contractor
- B General Building Contractor
- C Specialty Contractor





Job Order Contracting

Pilot program approved by the state legislature in September 2017 and sunsets January 1, 2022

Example of projects:

- Non-complex repetitive scope
- Incomplete punchlist items
- Emergency repairs and time-sensitive work

Contractors are selected based on best value:

- Unit Cost Mark-up
- Project Manager Resume
- Safety Record

No single task order may exceed \$1 million



The resolution also includes considerations for zero-waste, carbon emissions tracking, stormwater retention, and other sustainability measures.

LSEDV Program

Part of the LACCD Community Economic Development Program ("CED Program")

Geared to encouraging the use of local, small, emerging and disabled-veteran owned

businesses

- Certification from a Federal agency or by a public agency in California are accepted
- Small Contractor Boot Camp offered semi-annually to learn how to do business with LACCD
- Assist in identifying subcontracting opportunities with general contractors
- Use B2GNOW to monitor compliance
- CED staff available for one-on-one meetings to discuss bond program and LSEDV opportunities




