


Lack of Direct Regional Transit Connection





First / Last Mile Transit Connection

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
Metro K (Crenshaw/LAX) Line will provide access to/from the City of Inglewood and the greater LA County region

The K Line's Downtown Inglewood station is located 1.5 miles from new transformative investments including Kia Forum, SoFi Stadium, Hollywood Park and the Intuit Dome

Must complete first/last mile gap by providing new direct transit connection

Investment will result in:

- Significant environmental and socioeconomic benefits to Inglewood residents and the region
- Improve transit access to 2028 Summer Olympic and Paralympic Games



LA28 Summer Olympic and Paralympic Games

Inglewood
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- City will host at least three Olympic venues including Kia Forum, SoFi Stadium and Intuit Dome
- Planned games at the venues include Gymnastics at Kia Forum, Archery and the Opening and Closing Ceremonies at SoFi Stadium and others at the Intuit Dome
- Unique opportunity to showcase on the world stage America's ability to build modern sophisticated transit systems that advance the goals of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law goals
- ITC Project is a legacy investment that will continue to serve the community and the region after the Olympic games





Inglewood Transit Connector (ITC) Project Description




1.6-mile fully elevated, automated transit system with three stations connecting the Metro K Line to the following regionally serving destinations:

- Downtown Inglewood / Market Street
- Kia Forum
- SoFi Stadium and Hollywood Park
- Intuit Dome

ITC Project will be constructed using alternative delivery approach called Design-Build-Finance-Operate-Maintain (DBFOM)

Automated fixed guideway transit system:

- Rubber-tire (self or cable propelled)
- Monorail
- Steel wheel/rail



Environmental Justice

- More than 90% of area surrounding the Project is designated as a Disadvantaged and Low-Income Community
- Project will improve air quality by reducing carbon dioxide emission by over ~768k metric tons over the Project lifetime


Creating Jobs and Promoting Equity

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Construction of the project is projected to support nearly 11,000 construction jobs and \$822 million in labor income throughout the county.

Los Angeles Economic Development Corporation (LAEDC) report confirmed indirect and induced economic benefits including:

- Over \$2 billion in economic output for the County of Los Angeles.
- Over \$400 million in economic output for the City of Inglewood generated by ridership and visitors spending locally.
- Over \$260 million local, state, and federal taxes collected as result of ITC.





Community Workforce Agreement



DBFOM developer to comply with City's Community Workforce Agreement with the LA/OC Building and Construction Trade Council:

- Over \$260 million local, state, and federal taxes collected as result of ITC.
- Requires 35% local hire and 15% for transitional workers including but not limited to recently homeless men, women, and veterans.

City is completing development and adoption of FTA approved DBE Program for the Project and generation of DBE utilization goals for the DBFOM contract








Procurement Process



Funding Secured to Date through State and Regional Partnerships



- The City has secured a total of ~\$350 million; roughly 1/4 of the overall Project costs.
- City is pursuing ~\$650 million from the Federal Transit Administration's (FTA) Capital Investment Grant (CIG) New Starts Program along with other local sources.
- City applying for additional TIRCP grants,
 Solutions for Congested Corridors with
 Caltrans, RAISE grants, and other state funds.
- City will be committing Project and City generated revenue sources to repay the selected developer for capital and operating/maintenance costs.
