California's climate plan would increase electricity consumption by as much as 68% by 2045 which would create a tremendous strain on the power grid unless substantial private and public investments are made in clean energy. The State's power grid needs massive investments to attain the clean-energy future outlined in California's five-year climate roadmap. Our other utilities (water, wastewater, gas) are modernizing systems which in turn will require a greater demand for electricity. How will California get to 91% less use of fossil fuels by 2045 to achieve carbon neutrality?
