

Need

- Median age of VA Facilities is nearly 60 years old
- VISN 22 has 414 Bldgs that have \$2.8 B in Deficiencies



Projections

- MINORS: 2-3 projects
- NRM: Allocation has doubled every year until now
 - ✤ FY24 \$104 M reduced from \$175.5 M
 - ✤ FY25 \$101M reduced from \$142.5 M

- Services

Subcontracting Opportunities

- Although many of our construction and A/E projects may be awarded through existing contracts (IDIQ and MATOC), 85% of the contract work can be subcontracted out by prime contractor.
- Therefore, there are many opportunities for SDVOSB/VOSB on our upcoming construction projects.

DVA Rule of Two

- ✤ 38 U.S.C. § 8127(d) Use of Restricted Competition.—
- (1)Except as provided in paragraph (2) and in subsections (b) and (c), for purposes of meeting the goals under subsection (a), and in accordance with this section, a contracting officer of the Department shall award contracts on the basis of competition restricted to small business concerns owned and controlled by veterans or small business concerns owned and controlled by veterans with service-connected disabilities if the contracting officer has a reasonable expectation that two or more small business concerns owned and controlled by veterans or small business concerns owned and controlled by veterans with service-connected disabilities will submit offers and that the award can be made at a fair and reasonable price that offers best value to the United States.



SDVOSB/VOSB

VAAR §§ 819.7007 and 819.7008 summary

A contracting officers may award a contract to a verified SDVOSB or VOSB concern using procedures other than competitive procedures provided the anticipated award price of the contract (including options) will not exceed \$5M, the concern has been determined to be a responsible source with respect to performance, and the contract award can be made at a fair and reasonable price that offers best value to the Government.
