OF SANOTES

- Continuous traffic flow, speed control
- Improved accessibility for pedestrians, equestrians, cyclists

# Site Plan: Paseo Delicias/Del Dios at El Camino del Norte








## Cole Grade Road

- Widen 2.83 miles of road to accommodate center left-turn lane, bike lanes, and a trail
- Improvements to stormwater crossings and installation of "Green Street" drainage features
- New bridge over Key Creek
- Utility Undergrounding









# **Ashwood Street Corridor**

- Widening and straightening 1.3 miles of road to accommodate left-turn lanes, bike lanes, and pedestrian facilities
- Two new traffic signals
- Large retaining walls









# **Riverford Road Roundabouts**

- Consolidating 4 intersections into 2 roundabouts
- Shared-use pedestrian/bicycle pathways
- Reduce congestion & improve traffic movement
- Improve safety







## **Green Street Projects**





## **OVERVIEW**

- Capture and treat stormwater runoff
- Underserved communities (Spring Valley & Lakeside/Bostonia)
- Collaboration with Caltrans

## **ACTIONS**

- Add tree wells (biofiltration) and other elements
- Community improvements, including sidewalks and upgraded bus shelter

## **BENEFITS**

- Improve water quality and aesthetics
- Improve safety and pedestrian access






