

## About MTS

- Light Rail
  - 62 stations over 65 miles
- Bus
  - 100 fixed bus routes
  - ADA complementary paratransit service
- Ridership
  - Approaching pre-pandemic levels
- Contactless Payment Option
  - Implemented July 2024






## **MTS** Initiatives

- Zero Emission Bus (ZEB) Transition
  - Transition fleet by 2040
  - \$270M infrastructure over next 5 years
  - Additional Bus Division

#### Transit Oriented Development (TOD)

- Focus on increased density at MTS sites
- 20% affordable/rent restricted
- Meet transit operational needs
- MTS Trolley System Upgrades
  - Orange Line Improvement : \$135M
  - Traction Power Substation replacements: \$ 50M

#### • Planned Buildout through 2029:


- South Bay

- Division 6 Required for post 2030 growth





## **Clean Transit Advancement Campus (CTAC)**

- New \$350M all-ZEB division located in the heart of future service
- Focus on jobs, tech, innovation, and training
- Project site ★ on Federal Bl. near 47th
- Current Status:
  - Actively Seeking Funding
  - Land Acquisition: 60% complete
  - CEQA Certification: Complete
  - NEPA Certification: Complete
  - Design-Build project led by MTS
  - With Funding could be complete by 2030





## **MTS TOD Program**

- Revamped in 2019 MTS board Policy 18
  - Provided better direction to Developers on MTS needs & process
  - Prioritized:
    - Increased density for residential projects on MTS TOD sites
    - 20% affordable/rent restricted for very low and low income households
    - Transit operational needs at each site must be met
    - Analyze replacement parking needs / reduce parking to accommodate TOD
  - Required:
    - Payment of prevailing wage for construction phase
    - Use of skilled labor or project labor agreement








