SR-78 Corridor Rehab Project from 5/78 Separation to Escondido Blvd UC – Sub procurement in late 2024 / \$85.3 million

SR-94

- Culvert Rehab project from 94/5 Separation to East of Millar Ranch Road / \$72.2 million
- Phase 1 of the Connector Project Construction of bridge replacement, 3 aux lanes and 3 soundwalls with bike and ped improvements from Spring to Kenwood and on Route 125 from Spring to Murray / \$71 million

Program Delivery Challenges
