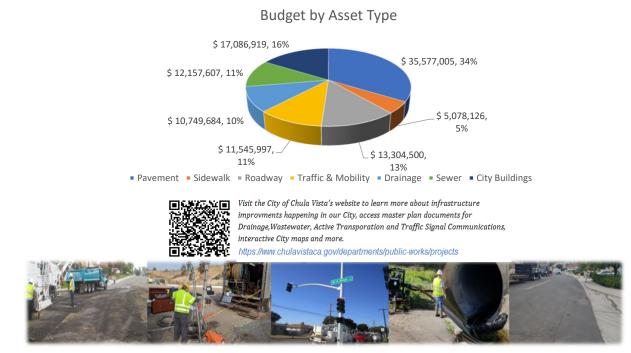

Construction Network Capital Plan Updates & Contracting Opportunities

The City of El Cajon Capital Improvement Program (CIP) is annually appropriated coinciding with the City's Budget process. This is normally conducted in the spring prior to the beginning of the fiscal year which begins on July 1st. The 5-year CIP plan identifies projects, priorities, and funding.

CIP Process

- Staff reviews currents needs and available funding sources.
- Projects are selected by current General Plan/Specific Plan and other plan priorities that align with City Council goals.
- Community engagement goals.

CIP Project Funding Sources

- Majority of CIP's are funded through non-General Funds sources.
- Special Revenue funds (Gas Tax, SB1, local TransNet, Waste Water Enterprise, etc.).
- Grants (Caltrans Highway Safety Improvement Program, CDBG, ARPA, San Diego River Conservancy, etc.).

CIP Project Categories

- Transportation (Street Improvements, Paving & Slurry seals, ADA curb ramps, sidewalks, street lighting, traffic signals, etc.) (25 projects totaling \$50.7 million).
- City Facilities, Parks, Public Safety (13 projects totaling \$14.5 million).
- Wastewater (Open channels, box culverts, sewer and storm drain projects, etc.) (10 projects totaling \$13.9 million.

Total Funding - \$79.1 million

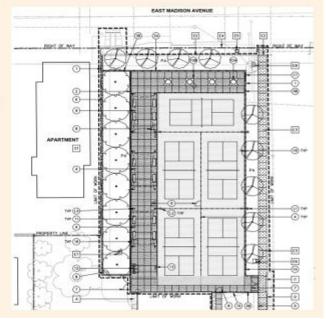

National City Capital Improvement Program Summary

The City of National City's Capital Improvement Program (CIP) represents a "sliding" fiveyear budgeting process for establishing the City's capital priorities and financing plan. The first year of the five-year program represents the "approved" capital budget, which is incorporated into the City's annual budget. Projects programmed for subsequent years are for planning purposes only and do not receive expenditure authority until they are allocated funding through future capital budgets approved by City Council. Prior to City Council approval, the CIP goes to the Planning Commission for a General Plan Conformity Review as required by California Government Code Section 65401 and National City Municipal Code 16.06.020(B).

The goal of the CIP is to identify, prioritize and coordinate the financing and timing of major public improvements. The CIP addresses the repair, replacement and expansion of the City's physical assets, which include, for example, streets, sidewalks, sewers, drainage facilities, buildings and parks. Notably, the City's Engineering & Public Works Department will be releasing a Request for Qualifications for professional consultant CIP support services in February 2025. All disciplines will be welcome to submit.
