
### **Preliminary Timeline**

- Fire Debris Removal: Completed
- 2. Facility Assessments: Underway
  - a) Environmental assessments and remediation
  - b) Infrastructure assessment (e.g., electrical, water, waste)
  - c) Structural evaluation of fire damage to buildings and sitewide
  - d) Building systems assessments (e.g., HVAC, communications)
- 3. Building and Infrastructure Replacement and Repairs: Summer 2025
  - a) Anticipated timeline pending assessments
- 4. Interim Classrooms: Anticipated 2025
  - a) Installation of temporary portable classrooms w/ administration and other support spaces Underway at Palisades HS and Marquez ES
- 5. Completion of Permanent Facilities: Contracts executed May 2025
  - a) Planning, design, and construction of proposed permanent facilities






#### Major Modernizations, Upgrades and Reconfigurations



#### CM Services We Will Need Over The Next Year

- 14 approved Prime CM Firms were awarded July 1, 2024.
- Open Season is May 1-31, 2025.
  - Prime Firms are encouraged to submit more Small Business (SBE) firms and guide them in the resume call submission process.
- Currently, Facilities has a total of 20 calls for resumes to fill 62 positions from various branches as well as other divisions in the District.
- We are exploring ways to improve current process: timelines, specific contract provisions, including on-boarding requirements. Conducting salary surveys is part of the plan for different staff augmentation classifications.
- CM Services are tapped by other LAUSD Offices and Divisions: CM Firms are encouraged to work with specialized consultants in the field required (scheduling/estimating).

If Not Successful After Several Attempts – Feel Free to Request for a Debrief

### Our Commitment- Staffing Contracts Will:

- Provide feedback to firms upon request for several calls for resumes without selections
- Provide a debrief for candidates interviewed but not selected as part of our process to provide input to the firms for non-selection
- Provide assistance in resumes submitted, such as other open calls for resumes for classifications that are best suited based on candidates' qualifications
- Respond to the calls for resumes per timeline and encourage sponsoring departments to submit shortlist in a timely manner
- Encourage firms not able to hire or not actively participating to submit resumes



# Policy and Procuredural Updates

### Legislative Initiatives

- Best Value Procurement: School Districts (AB 361)
   Status: Passed the Assembly Education Committee March 12, 2025
  - o Removes the Sunset for LAUSD's Best Value Procurement Pilot Program
  - Expands the Option Statewide to any School District for Public Works
     Projects Over \$1 Million That Meet Specified Labor Requirements
  - Districts Will No Longer Have to Submit 3<sup>rd</sup> Party Evaluations
- Alternative Design-Build Contracts (AB 185 Education Omnibus Trailer Bill) Status: Effective January 1, 2023
  - CA Ed Code Ch 2.6. Alternative Design-Build Contracts [§ 17250.60 –.69]
  - Establishes Alternative Design-Build Process for Projects Over \$5 Million.
  - Allows School Districts and Design-Builders to Work Cooperatively
     Through the Design and Construction Phases of a Project and to
     Negotiate Actual Construction Costs During the Development of Design or Once the Design Is Complete

### Policy and Procedure Updates

#### **Effective July 2024**

- Organizational Realignment
- Modified Submittal Review Process
  - M&O Technical Quality Support Team Reviews Specific Mechanical and Electrical Submittals (Reduced from 317 to 35 Specification Sections)
  - Objective: Decrease Review And Response Times
  - Objective: Decrease Issue Resolution During Construction

#### Effective January / February 2025

- Fair Cost Estimating Escalation Process
- Reduced Contractor Staff minimum experience requirements

#### **Effective April 2025**

General Contractor Markup Increase to 10% for Change Orders

### Other Items Requiring Further Action

- Implementation of Comprehensive Facilities Training
- Improved Due Diligence to Reduce 'Unforeseens'
- Expedited Payment Options (i.e. Steel, Switchgear)
- Payment for Stored Materials
- Design Build Obligation To Validate Conditions
- Warrantability For Geotech, As-builts, Asbestos And Hazardous Materials
- Design Build Procurement Timeframe
- Alternate Design Build Procurement and Training
- Staffing Levels Across Construction Phases



# Small Business Boot Camp

### **Boot Camp Overview**

- Conducted Bi-Annually: Spring and Fall
  - o Two-Hour Seminars Held Weekly
  - Hybrid Schedule, via ZOOM and In-Person at Beaudry Headquarters
- Small Contractors Receive Training from Subject-Matter Experts Over an Intensive 9-Week Program with Seminars that Cover:
  - o Estimating
  - o Bonding
  - o Scheduling
  - Labor Compliance
  - o Prequalification

- Project Stabilization Agreement
- Bidding on Informal Contracts
- o And more for FREE
